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THE GEORGIAN GROUP ARCHITECTURAL AWARDS 2010

The Georgian Group Architectural Awards recognise excellence in the restoration of Georgian buildings and in the design of new buildings in the classical tradition or in Georgian contexts.

The awards will be presented at Christie's, King Street, London SW1 in November 2010. The deadline for entries is 5pm on Friday 30 July 2010.

AWARD CATEGORIES

The categories for the 2010 Awards are:

Restoration of a Georgian country house

2009 Winner: *Cairness House, Lonmay, Aberdeenshire*

Restoration of a Georgian building in an urban setting

2009 Winner: *Somerset House, Halifax, Yorkshire*

Re-use of a Georgian building

2009 Winner: *Navigation Warehouse, Wakefield, Yorkshire*

Restoration of a Georgian church

2009 Winner: *St Lawrence Mereworth, Kent*

Restoration of a Georgian garden or landscape

Town and country schemes are equally acceptable.

2009 Winner: *Hardwick Park, Co. Durham*

New building in the classical tradition

May be residential, non-domestic or a monument or ornamental building.

Entries will be expected to conform to the principles of classical design.

2009 Winner: *264-267 Tottenham Court Road, London W1*

The Giles Worsley Award for a new building in a Georgian context

Schemes may be in any stylistic idiom. They may (for example) adjoin or extend a Georgian building, be in the vicinity of one or have a prominent place in a predominantly Georgian townscape.

2009 Winner: *Home Farm, Hartforth, Yorkshire*

For the purpose of the Awards, the term 'Georgian' embraces the period of classical ascendancy in Britain and is taken to mean 1660 – 1840.

ELIGIBILITY

Schemes must be in the United Kingdom, Isle of Man or Channel Islands.

Schemes must have reached practical completion between 1st January 2009

and 1st August 2010. There is no entry fee.

JUDGING

Entries will be judged by a panel including:

A shortlist will be drawn up from entries in each category; shortlisted entrants only will be notified by Friday 8th October 2010. The judges' decision is final.

PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

Award winners will be announced at an evening ceremony to be held at Christie's St James's in November 2010. Certificates will be awarded to the client and architect of the winning scheme. It is a condition of entry that the client (or his/her representative) and the architect of each shortlisted scheme attend the ceremony. Shortlisted entrants will be required to provide, no later than 21st October 2010, six 300 dpi jpeg images of their scheme on a PC readable CD, zip disk or similar labelled with the scheme name, for use during the award ceremony and as part of the promotion of the awards. For restoration schemes at least four images must be 'before and after' shots.

EXHIBITION AND PUBLICITY

Shortlisted schemes will be exhibited at 6 Fitzroy Square London W1 after the awards ceremony. Shortlisted entrants will be required to provide an exhibition board with images and a description of their scheme by 29th October 2010.

The submission of an entry form will be taken to imply the granting of permission to publish all materials and particulars of the scheme, including photographs and plans, free of copyright restrictions. Entrants agree to allow reasonable access to the media should they wish to interview them. Winning schemes will be highlighted in the magazine of The Georgian Group. All information on the results will be embargoed for publication until after the presentation ceremony.

DEADLINE

Entry forms and supporting material must arrive at the office of the Georgian Group (6 Fitzroy Square, London W1T 5DX) by 5pm on Friday 30th July 2010.

 - A plan of the completed scheme, including (for buildings) plans of each principal floor.
